1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE DHR TO SUSPEND NURSING HOME ADMISSIONS 3 DURING ADVERSE ACTION ON A LICENSE. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 Section 1. G.S. 131E-103(A) reads as rewritten: Subject to subsection (b), the Department shall have the authority to deny a 6 "(a) new or renewal application for a license, and to amend, recall, suspend or revoke an 7 existing license upon a determination that there has been a substantial failure to comply 8 9 with the provisions of this Part or the rules promulgated adopted under this Part. The Secretary or a designee shall suspend the admission of any new patients or 10 residents at any nursing home or domiciliary home whenever an adverse action is taken 11 on a license according to this section. This suspension shall remain in effect until and 12 unless the administrative law judge stays the action according to G.S. 150B-33." 13 Sec. 2. G.S. 131E-109 reads as rewritten: 14 Any person establishing, conducting, managing or operating any nursing 15 "(a) home without a license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be 16 17 liable for a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first offense and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each subsequent offense. Each day of 18 19 a continuing violation after conviction shall be considered a separate offense. 20 Any person acting under the authority of the Department who gives advance (b)21 notice to an operator of a nursing home of the date or time that the nursing home is to be inspected shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be liable for a 22 fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for a period not to 23

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1 exceed 30 days, or both. The inspection of a nursing home for initial licensure shall be 2 exempt from the prohibition of prior notice. All subsequent inspections must comply 3 with the provisions of this subsection. 4 The Secretary or a designee may suspend the admission of any new patients (c) 5 or residents at any nursing home or domiciliary home where the conditions of the 6 nursing home or domiciliary home are detrimental to the health or safety of the patient 7 or resident. This suspension shall remain in effect until the Secretary is satisfied that 8 conditions or circumstances merit the removal of the suspension. This subsection shall 9 be in addition to authority to suspend or revoke the license of the home. 10 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this Part, any person who violates any (d) provision of this Part or who willfully fails to perform any act required, or who willfully 11 12 performs any act prohibited by this Part, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon 13 conviction shall be punished by a fine or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 14 two years or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court;

Provided, however, that any person who willfully violates any rule adopted by the Commission under this Part or who willfully fails to perform any act required by, or who willfully performs any act prohibited by, these rules shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars

19 (\$50.00) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 30 days."

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Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
