1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT TRAFFICKING IN METHAMPHETAMINE IS A
3	CRIMINAL OFFENSE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 90-95(h) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
6	"(3a) Any person who sells, manufactures, delivers, transports, or possesses 28
7	grams or more of methamphetamine shall be guilty of a felony which felony shall be
8	known as 'trafficking in methamphetamine' and if the quantity of such substance or
9	mixture involved:
10	<u>a.</u> <u>Is 28 grams or more, but less than 200 grams, such person shall</u>
11	be punished as a Class G felon and shall be sentenced to a term
12	of at least seven years in the State's prison and shall be fined not
13	less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000);
14	b. Is 200 grams or more, but less than 400 grams, such person
15	shall be punished as a Class F felon and shall be sentenced to a
16	term of at least 14 years in the State's prison and shall be fined
17	not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000);
18	c. <u>Is 400 grams or more, such person shall be punished as a Class</u>
19	D felon and shall be sentenced to a term of at least 35 years in
20	the State's prison and shall be fined at least two hundred fifty
21	thousand dollars (\$250,000)."
22	Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989, and shall apply to
23	offenses occurring on or after that date.
