2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARITABLE SOLICITATION LICENSURE ACT.

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Section 1. G.S.131C-4 reads as rewritten:

## 5 "§ 131C-4. Licensure required for charitable solicitation.

6 (a) Any person who solicits charitable contributions shall apply for and obtain an 7 annual license from the Department of Human Resources. A person who is authorized 8 to solicit on behalf of a licensed or exempt person is not required to obtain a license 9 under this section.

10 (b) A person other than a professional solicitor or professional fund-raising counsel 11 may solicit charitable contributions after filing the <u>completed</u> application until the 12 Department notifies him that the application has been denied and he waives or exhausts 13 his administrative and judicial remedies under Chapter 150B.

14 (c) A person who has been denied a license and has waived or exhausted his 15 administrative and judicial remedies under Chapter 150B shall not solicit charitable 16 contributions until another application has been filed with the Department and a license 17 issued by the Department."
