2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR SANITARY
3	SEWAGE SYSTEM CONTRACTORS, TO REQUIRE CERTIFICATION OF
4	SANITARY SEWAGE CONTRACTORS, AND TO ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE
5	FEE SCHEDULE FOR IMPROVEMENT PERMITS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Chapter 90A is amended by adding a new article to read:
8	" <u>ARTICLE 5.</u>
9	"CERTIFICATION OF SANITARY SEWAGE SYSTEM CONTRACTORS.
10	" <u>§ 90A-71. Definitions.</u>
11	The following definitions shall apply throughout this Article:
12	(1) <u>'Commission' means the Commission for Health Services.</u>
13	(2) <u>'Department' means the Department of Human Resources.</u>
14	(3) <u>'Sanitary sewage system' means a complete system of sewage</u>
15	collection, treatment, and disposal including septic tank systems, low-
16	pressure pipe systems, mechanical aeration systems, or other such
17	systems.
18	(4) <u>'Sanitary sewage system contractor' or 'contractor' means a person</u>
19	engaged in the business of installing, constructing, repairing, or
20	maintaining a sanitary sewage system.
21	" <u>§ 90A-72. Certification program.</u>
22	(a) The Commission shall by rule establish and administer a certification
23	program for sanitary sewage system contractors. The program shall be designed to
24	provide voluntary certification of contractors who install, construct, repair, or maintain

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1	conventional septic tank systems and to provide mandatory certification of contractors
2	who install, construct, repair, or maintain sanitary sewage systems other than septic
3	tanks. The Commission shall adopt rules to implement the program by July 1, 1990.
4	(b) The Department shall be authorized to charge an application fee not to exceed
5	one hundred dollars (\$100.00)."
6	Sec. 2. Article 11 of Chapter 130A is amended by adding a new section to
7	read:
8	" <u>§ 130A-342. Improvement permit fees.</u>
9	The Department of Human Resources may charge fees for improvement permits as
10	follows. A fee of no more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) may be charged for new
11	improvement permits. A fee of no more than ten dollars (\$10.00) may be charged for
12	repair improvement permits. A fee of no more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be
13	charged for alternative system permits."
14	Sec. 3. Section 2 of this act shall become effective July 1, 1989, and shall
15	apply to permits issued on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective upon

16 ratification.
