## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE FIRST TIME BUYERS OF HUNTING LICENSES TO
3	COMPLETE A HUNTER SAFETY COURSE, AND TO REQUIRE THAT SUCH
4	COURSE BE MADE AVAILABLE IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THIS
5	STATE.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
8	section 113-270.1A to read as follows:
9	" <u>§ 113-270.1A. Hunter Safety Course Required.</u>
10	(a) On or after July 1, 1990, a person, regardless of age, may not procure a hunting
11	license or hunt in this State without producing a certificate of competency or a hunting
12	license issued prior to July 1, 1990, or making out an affidavit that he had such a
13	license.
14	(b) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall institute and coordinate a
15	statewide course of instruction in hunter ethics, wildlife laws and regulations, and
16	competency and safety in the handling of firearms, and in so doing, may cooperate with
17	any political subdivision, or with any reputable organization having as one of its
18	objectives the promotion of competency and safety in the handling of firearms,
19	including local rod and gun clubs.
20	(1) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall designate those persons or
21	agencies authorized to give the course of instruction, and this
22	designation shall be valid until revoked by the Commission. Those
23	designated persons shall submit to the Wildlife Resources Commission

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1		validated listings naming all persons who have successfully completed

21	(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the sale of lifetime

24	thereof when accompanied by an adult at least 21 years of age who is licensed to hunt in

Such course 6 shall be in conformance with the provisions of G.S. 113-270.1A."
