2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE FIRST TIME BUYERS OF HUNTING LICENSES TO
3	COMPLETE A HUNTER SAFETY COURSE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
6	section 113-270.1A to read as follows:
7	" <u>§ 113-270.1A. Hunter Safety Course Required.</u>
8	(a) On or after July 1, 1991, a person, regardless of age, may not procure a hunting
9	license or hunt in this State without producing a certificate of competency or a hunting
10	license issued prior to July 1, 1991, or making out an affidavit that he had such a
11	license.
12	(b) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall institute and coordinate a
13	statewide course of instruction in hunter ethics, wildlife laws and regulations, and
14	competency and safety in the handling of firearms, and in so doing, may cooperate with
15	any political subdivision, or with any reputable organization having as one of its
16	objectives the promotion of competency and safety in the handling of firearms,
17	including local rod and gun clubs.
18	(1) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall designate those persons or
19	agencies authorized to give the course of instruction, and this
20	designation shall be valid until revoked by the Commission. Those
21	designated persons shall submit to the Wildlife Resources Commission
22	validated listings naming all persons who have successfully completed
23	the course of instruction.

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1	( <b>2</b> )	The Wildlife Resources Commission may conduct the course in hunter
