2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE NORTH CAROLINA WILDLIFE RESOURCES 3 COMMISSION TO SCHEDULE MANAGED HUNTS FOR GAME BIRDS.

- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 113-264(d) reads as rewritten:

6 "(d) The Wildlife Resources Commission may schedule managed hunts for any 7 species of big game-wildlife to be held on game lands. Participants in such hunts shall be 8 selected at random by computer from properly licensed applicants. A nonrefundable fee 9 of five dollars (\$5.00) will be required of each applicant to defray the cost of processing 10 the applications."

Sec. 2. G.S. 113-291.2(a) reads as rewritten:

12 In accordance with the supply of wildlife and other factors it determines to be "(a) of public importance, the Wildlife Resources Commission may fix seasons and bag 13 limits upon the wild animals and wild birds authorized to be taken that it deems 14 15 necessary or desirable in the interests of the conservation of wildlife resources. The authority to fix seasons includes the closing of seasons completely when necessary and 16 fixing the hours of hunting. The authority to fix bag limits includes the setting of season 17 18 and possession limits. Different seasons and bag limits may be set in differing areas; early or extended seasons and different or unlimited bag limits may be authorized on 19 controlled shooting preserves, game lands, and public hunting grounds; and special or 20 21 extended seasons may be fixed for those engaging in falconry, using primitive weapons, 22 or taking wildlife under other special conditions. Unless modified by rules of the Wildlife Resources Commission, the seasons, shooting hours, bag limits, and possession 23 limits fixed by the United States Department of Interior or any successor agency for 24

migratory game birds in North Carolina must be followed, and a violation of the 1 applicable federal rules is hereby made unlawful. When the applicable federal rules 2 3 require that the State limit participation in seasons and/or bag limits for migratory game birds, the Wildlife Resources Commission may schedule managed hunts for migratory 4 5 game birds. Participants in such hunts shall be selected at random by computer from properly licensed applicants. A nonrefundable fee of five dollars (\$5.00) shall be 6 required of each applicant to defray the cost of processing the applications. 7 8 Where there is a muzzle-loading firearm season for deer, with a bag limit of five or 9 more, one antlerless deer may be taken. Dogs may not be used for hunting deer during 10 such season."

11 • Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
