AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT PERSONS SUBJECT TO SELECTIVE SERVICE
REGISTRATION MUST REGISTER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR STATE OR LOCAL
GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT OR RECEIPT OF PUBLIC BENEFITS.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
Part in Article 9 to read:
"PART 19A.
"SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION.
"§ 143B-421.1. Selective Service registration.
(a) A person shall not be eligible for employment by or service for the State or a political subdivision of the State, including, but not limited to, all boards and
commissions, departments, agencies, institutions, and instrumentalities, nor shall a
person be eligible to receive any public benefits, including, but not limited to,
scholarships, grants, or payments of any kind, from the State or a political subdivision
of the State unless the person has registered with the Selective Service System if
required by the Federal Military Selective Service Act (62 Stat. 604, 50 United States
Code App., Sec. 453).
(b) The prohibitions in subsection (a) of this section shall not apply if the
person can prove by a preponderance of the evidence:
(1) That the requirement to register with the Selective Service System has
terminated or become inapplicable to the person: or

That the failure to register with the Selective Service System was not a knowing or willful failure to register."
