Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 6 7 Article to read: 8 "ARTICLE 25. "MEDICAL ETHICS PRACTICE ACT. 9 "§ 90-350. Notice to patient of certain referrals. 10 (a) A health care provider licensed under any provision of this Chapter who 11 makes a referral to another health care provider licensed under any provision of this 12 Chapter or licensed under any provision of Chapter 131E or who makes a referral to any 13 other health care provider, for which there is to be for the health care provider making 14 15 the referral: Remuneration of any type, including the beneficial ownership of any 16 (1) financial interest: 17 18 Referral fee; or (2) 19 Fee generating opportunity, (3) must disclose this to the person being referred. 20 21 The disclosure required by subsection (a) of this section must be in writing. on a separate form containing no other information, and must be given to the person 22

being referred at the time the referral is made.

(c) A health care provider licensed under any provision of this Chapter or
licensed under any provision of Chapter 131E or any other health care provider who
receives a referral from another health care provider licensed under any provision of this
Chapter, for which there is to be for the health care provider making the referral:

- (1) Remuneration of any type, including the beneficial ownership of any financial interest;
- (2) Referral fee; or

- (3) Fee generating opportunity,
- must disclose this to the person being referred.
 - (d) The disclosure required by subsection (c) of this section must be in writing, on a separate form containing no other information, and must be given to the person being referred at the time the provider first provides services under the referral.
- (e) A violation of this section shall be an unethical practice, for which a health care provider licensed under this Chapter or Chapter 131E may be disciplined by revocation or suspension of such license, or lesser penalty in the discretion of the licensing authority.
- (f) In the case of any violation of this section, the person receiving services shall not be obligated to pay for such services, nor shall any third party-party payor be liable.
- (g) This section does not authorize any practice which is prohibited by law or by any rules or regulations adopted under this Chapter or Chapter 131E concerning the conduct of a licensee."
- Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989.
