Section 1. Article 13 of Chapter 66 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 66-67.2. Persons who sell used goods on consignment must keep certain records. (a) A person who is engaged in the business of selling used tangible personal	
property on consignment must keep a record of each piece of property consigned to that	
	The record must contain all of the following information:
(1)	A description of the property, including any model or serial number of
<u>\/</u>	the property.
<u>(2)</u>	The name, residence address, telephone number, and drivers license
\ 	number or other identifying number of the owner of the property.
<u>(3)</u>	The date the property was consigned.
$\overline{(4)}$	A description of the owner of the property, including sex, race, and
, ,	approximate height and weight.
<u>(5)</u>	The owner's stated value of the property.
<u>(b)</u> The o	consignee shall provide the owner with a copy of the record required by
subsection (a) of this section.	

A person who fails to keep the records required by this section is guilty of a

misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for up to six months, a fine of up to five

- 1 <u>hundred dollars (\$500.00)</u>, or both. A law enforcement agency may examine the records required to be kept under this section during business hours.
 - (d) This section does not apply to a motor vehicle.
- 4 (e) This section does not apply to any nonprofit organization exempt from the taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3))."
- Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991, and applies to property consigned on or after that date.
