2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO
3	PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN RECYCLING BINS AT HIGHWAY REST AREAS,
4	TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO PROVIDE AND
5	MAINTAIN RECYCLING BINS AT THE STATE FAIRGROUNDS IN
6	RALEIGH, AND TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT,
7	HEALTH, AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN
8	RECYCLING BINS AT STATE PARKS AND AT THE NORTH CAROLINA
9	ZOOLOGICAL PARK.
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
11	Section 1. G.S. 130A-309.14 is amended by adding two new subsections to
12	read:
13	"(j) <u>The Department of Transportation shall provide and maintain recycling bins</u>
14	for the collection and recycling of newspaper, aluminum cans, glass containers, and
15	recyclable plastic beverage containers at each rest area located in this State on a
16	highway in the Interstate Highway System or in the State highway system.
17	(k) The Department of Agriculture shall provide and maintain recycling bins for
18	the collection and recycling of newspaper, aluminum cans, glass containers, and
19	recyclable plastic beverage containers at the State Fairgrounds in Raleigh."
20	Sec. 2. G.S. 130A-309.06(a) reads as rewritten:
21	"(a) In addition to other powers and duties set forth in this Part, the Department
22	shall:

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1	(1)	Develop a comprehensive solid waste management plan consistent
2		with this Part by 1 March 1991. The plan shall be developed in
3		consultation with units of local government and shall be updated at
4		least every three years. In developing the State solid waste
5		management plan, the Department shall hold public hearings around
6		the State and shall give notice of these public hearings to all units of
7		local government and regional planning agencies.
8	(2)	Provide guidance for the orderly collection, transportation, storage,
9		separation, processing, recovery, recycling, and disposal of solid waste
10		throughout the State.
11	(3)	Encourage coordinated local activity for solid waste management
12		within a common geographical area.
13	(4)	Provide planning, technical, and financial assistance to units of local
14		government and State agencies for reduction, recycling, reuse, and
15		processing of solid waste and for safe and environmentally sound solid
16		waste management and disposal.
17	(5)	Cooperate with appropriate federal agencies and private organizations
18	(-)	in carrying out the provisions of this Part.
19	(6)	Promote and assist the development of solid waste reduction,
20	(0)	recycling, and resource recovery programs which preserve and
21		enhance the quality of the air, water, and other natural resources of the
22		State.
23	(7)	Maintain a directory of recycling and resource recovery systems in the
24	(\prime)	State and provide assistance with matching recovered materials with
25		markets.
26	(8)	Manage a program of grants for programs for recycling and special
20 27	(0)	waste management, and for programs which provide for the safe and
28		proper management of solid waste.
29	(9)	Provide for the education of the general public and the training of solid
30	(\mathcal{I})	waste management professionals to reduce the production of solid
31		waste management professionals to reduce the production of solid waste, to ensure proper processing and disposal of solid waste, and to
32		encourage recycling and solid waste reduction.
33	(10)	Develop descriptive literature to inform units of local government of
33	(10)	their solid waste management responsibilities and opportunities.
35	(11)	Conduct at least one workshop each year in each region served by a
36	(11)	council of governments.

37	<u>(12)</u>	Provide and maintain recycling bins for the collection and recycling of
38		newspaper, aluminum cans, glass containers, and recyclable plastic
39		beverage containers at each picnic area and each concession located in
40		a State park. The Department may require a private individual or
41		company that operates a concession pursuant to G.S. 113-35(d) to
42		provide and maintain any recycling bin required under this subdivision
43		at any privately operated concession.

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 (13) Provide and maintain recycling bins for the collection and recycling of newspaper, aluminum cans, glass containers, and recyclable plastic beverage containers at the North Carolina Zoological Park." Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
