1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES 2 COMPLETE STAFF REVIEW OF LOCAL NEGATIVE ACTIONS WITHIN 3 4 SIXTY DAYS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 131D-34(h) reads as rewritten: 6 The Secretary shall establish a penalty review committee within the 7 Department, which shall review administrative penalties assessed pursuant to this 8 section and pursuant to G.S. 131E-129. The Secretary shall ensure that departmental 9 staff review of local departments of social services' penalty recommendations along 10 with prepared staff recommendations for the penalty review committee are completed 11 within 60 days of receipt by the Department of the local recommendations. The Penalty 12 Review Committee shall not review penalty recommendations agreed to by the 13 Department and the long-term care facility for Type B violations except those violations 14 that have been previously cited against the long-term care facility during the previous 15 12 months or within the time period of the previous licensure inspection, whichever 16 time period is longer. The Secretary shall ensure that the Nursing Home/Rest Home 17

Penalty Review Committee established by this subsection is comprised of nine

At least one member shall be appointed from each of the following

(1) A licensed pharmacist;

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members. categories:

- (2) A registered nurse experienced in long-term care;
- 23 (3) A representative of a nursing home;
- 24 (4) A representative of a domiciliary home; and

(5)) A	public	member.

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Neither the pharmacist, nurse, nor public member appointed under this subsection nor any member of their immediate families shall be employed by or own any interest in a nursing home or domiciliary home.

Each member of the Committee shall serve a term of two years. The initial terms of the members shall commence on August 3, 1989. The Secretary shall fill all vacancies. Unexcused absences from three consecutive meetings constitute resignation from the Committee."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1992.
