Where the single-axle load exceeds the statutory limits, but 1 a. does not exceed 21,000 pounds. 2 3 b. Where the vehicle or combination of vehicles has tandem axles, but the tandem-axle weight does not exceed 40,000 pounds. 4 5 When a vehicle is operated in violation of G.S. 20-118(b)(4) the owner (3) 6 of the vehicle shall be permitted, without penalty, to shift the load 7 within the vehicle from one axle to another to comply with the weight 8 limits where the single-axle weight does not exceed the posted limit by 9 2,500 pounds. 10 **(4)** A truck or other motor vehicle shall be exempt from such light-traffic road limitations provided for pursuant to G.S. 20-118(b)(4), when 11 12 transporting supplies, material or equipment necessary to carry out a farming operation engaged in the production of meats and agricultural 13 14 crops and livestock or poultry by-products or a business engaged in the 15 harvest or processing of seafood when the destination of such vehicle and load is located solely upon said light-traffic road. 16 17 (5) A truck or other motor vehicle shall be exempt from such light-traffic 18 road limitations provided for pursuant to G.S. 20-118(b)(4), when transporting processed and unprocessed seafood from boats or any 19 20 other point of origin, meats and agricultural crop products originating 21 from a farm, or forest products originating from a farm or from woodlands, or livestock or poultry by-products from point of origin, on 22 23 a light-traffic road to the nearest State maintained road which is not 24 posted to prohibit the transportation of statutory load limits. A truck or other motor vehicle shall be exempt from such light-traffic 25 (6) 26 road limitations provided by G.S. 20-118(b)(4) when such motor 27 vehicles are owned, operated by or under contract to a public utility, electric or telephone membership corporation or municipality and such 28 29 motor vehicles are used in connection with installation, restoration or 30 emergency maintenance of utility services. A wrecker may tow a disabled vehicle or combination of vehicles in an 31 **(7)** 32 emergency to the nearest feasible point for parking or storage without 33 being in violation of G.S. 20-118 provided that the wrecker and towed vehicle or combination of vehicles otherwise meet all requirements of 34 35 this section. 36 (8) A firefighting vehicle operated by any member of a municipal or rural 37 fire department in the performance of his duties, regardless of whether 38 members of that fire department are paid or voluntary and any vehicle 39 of a voluntary lifesaving organization, when operated by a member of that organization while answering an official call shall be exempt from 40 41 such light-traffic road limitations provided by G.S. 20-118(b)(4).

Fully enclosed motor vehicles designed specifically for collecting, compacting and hauling garbage from residences or from garbage

dumpsters shall, when operating for those purposes, be exempt from

the light-traffic road limitation as provided by G.S. 20-118(b)(4). This 1 2 exemption shall not apply to vehicles transporting hazardous waste as 3 defined in G.S. 130A-290(5), spent nuclear fuel regulated under G.S. 20-167.1, low-level radioactive waste as defined in G.S. 104E-5(9a), 4 5 or radioactive material as defined in G.S. 104E-5(14). 6 (10)Fully enclosed motor vehicles designed specifically for collecting. 7 compacting and hauling garbage from residences, or from garbage 8 dumpsters shall, when operating for those purposes, be allowed a 9 single axle weight not to exceed 23,500 pounds on the steering axle on 10 vehicles equipped with a boom, or on the rear axle on vehicles loaded from the rear. This exemption shall not apply to vehicles transporting 11 12 hazardous waste as defined in G.S. 130A-290(5), spent nuclear fuel regulated under G.S. 20-167.1, low-level radioactive waste as defined 13 14 in G.S. 104E-5(9a), or radioactive material as defined in G.S. 104E-15 5(14). 16 (11)A truck or other motor vehicle shall be exempt for light-traffic road 17 limitations issued under subdivision (b)(4) of this section when 18 transporting heating fuel for on-premises use at a destination located on the light-traffic road." 19 20 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
