A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AID PARENTS OF LOW-INCOME CHILDREN NEEDING DAY  
2 CARE TO BECOME SELF-SUFFICIENT WITHOUT JEOPARDIZING THE  
3 VERY CHILD CARE THAT IS ESSENTIAL TO THIS SELF-SUFFICIENCY  
4 AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. Effective July 1, 1993, eligibility limits for State and federal child  
8 day care subsidies are increased as follows:

9 (1) For families already receiving subsidies, to seventy-five percent (75%)  
10 of median income; and

11 (2) For families initially needing subsidies on or after this date, one  
12 economic "notch" above their current eligibility level.

13 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
14 Human Resources, Division of Facility Services, Day Care Section the sum of two  
15 million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of two million  
16 dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to implement this act.

17 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
