3	ACRES REQUIRED FOR A TRACT OF FORESTLAND TO QUALIFY FOR USE

5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 105-277.3(a)(3) reads as rewritten:
7	"(3) Individually owned forestland consisting of one or more tracts, one of
8	which consists of at least 20-10 acres that are in actual production and
9	are not included in a farm unit."
10	Sec. 2. This act is effective for taxes imposed for taxable years beginning on
11	or after January 1, 1993. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 105-277.4(a), an
12	application for the benefit provided in this act for the 1993-94 tax year shall be
13	considered timely if it is filed on or before September 1, 1993.
