2	AN ACT TO ALLOW ALL TRAILERS TO OBTAIN MULTIYEAR LICENSE
3	PLATES, TO ALLOW OWNERS OF HORSELESS CARRIAGES TO OBTAIN
4	MULTIYEAR LICENSE PLATES, TO CLARIFY THE DEFINITION OF
5	SEMITRAILER, AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE
6	CHANGES TO THE LAWS CONCERNING SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 20-88(c) reads as rewritten:
9	"(c) There shall be paid to the Division annually, as of the first day of January, for the
10	registration and licensing of trailers or semitrailers, The fee for a trailer is ten dollars
11	(\$10.00) for each year or any part of the license year for which said license is issued. a
12	year. The fee is payable on or before January 1 of each year. Upon the application of
13	the owner of a semitrailer, trailer, the Division may issue a multiyear plate and
14	registration card for the semitrailer trailer for a fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). A
15	multiyear plate and registration card for a semitrailer trailer are valid until the owner
16	transfers the semitrailer trailer to another person or surrenders the plate and registration
17	card to the Division. A multiyear plate may not be transferred to another vehicle.
18	The Division shall issue a multiyear semitrailer trailer plate in a different color than
19	an annual semitrailer trailer plate and shall include the word 'multiyear' on the plate. The
20	Division may not issue a multiyear plate for a house trailer."
21	Sec. 2. G.S. 20-4.01(31)d. and e. read as rewritten:
22	"d. Semitrailers Vehicles without motive power designed for
23	carrying property or persons and for being drawn by a motor
24	vehicle, and so constructed that part of their weight or their load

1			rests upon or is carried by the pulling vehicle. Trailers that are
2			supported at their front end by the device of a fifth wheel
3			supplied by a truck tractor or by converter gear.
4			e. Trailers. – Vehicles without motive power designed for carrying
5			property or persons wholly on their own structure and to be drawn
6			by a motor vehicle, including 'pole trailers' or a pair of wheels
7			used primarily to balance a load rather than for purposes of
8			transportation."

28			cadet member shall begin with the number '501'.
29		(4)	Class D Citizen's Radio Station Operator. – Issuable to a Class D
30		(.)	citizen's radio station operator licensed by the Federal
31			Communications Commission. The plate shall bear the operator's
32			official Class D citizen's radio station call letters.
33		(5)	Clerk of Superior Court. – Issuable to a clerk of superior court. The
34		(0)	plate shall bear the phrase 'Clerk Superior Court' and the letter 'C'
35			followed by a number that indicates the county the clerk serves.
36		(6)	Coast Guard Auxiliary Member. – Issuable to an active member of the
37		(0)	United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. The plate shall bear the phrase
38			'Coast Guard Auxiliary'.
39		(6a)	Collegiate Insignia Plate. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor
40		(04)	vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a
41			phrase or an insignia representing a public or private college or
42			university.
43		(7)	Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of
44			the Congressional Medal of Honor.
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1		(8)	Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the
2			United States who suffered a 100% service-connected disability.
3		(9)	District Attorney Issuable to a North Carolina or United States
4			District Attorney. The plate issuable to a North Carolina district
5			attorney shall bear the letters 'DA' followed by a number that
6			represents the prosecutorial district the district attorney serves. The
7			plate for a United States attorney shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Attorney'
8			followed by a number that represents the district the attorney serves,
9			with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 3
10		$(1 \circ)$	being the Western District.
11		(10)	Fire Department or Rescue Squad Member. – Issuable to an active
12			regular member or volunteer member of a fire department, rescue
13			squad, or both a fire department and rescue squad. The plate shall bear
14		(11)	the words 'Firefighter', 'Rescue Squad', or 'Firefighter-Rescue Squad'.
15 16		(11)	Historic Vehicle Owner. – Issuable for a motor vehicle that is at least
10 17			35 years old measured from the date of manufacture. The plate for a vehicle that is 35 to 50 years old shall bear the phrase 'Antique'. The
17			plate for a vehicle that is at least 50 years old shall bear the phrase
10 19			'Horseless Carriage'. <u>A plate issued under this subdivision for a</u>
20			horseless carriage may be an annual plate or a multiyear plate. A
21			multiyear plate is valid until the vehicle's owner transfers the vehicle
22			to another person or surrenders the plate to the Division. A multiyear
23			plate may not be transferred to another vehicle.
24		(11a)	Historical Attraction Plate Issuable to the registered owner of a
25			motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a
26			phrase or an insignia representing a publicly owned or nonprofit
27			historical attraction located in North Carolina.
28		(12)	Honorary Plate Issuable to a member of the Honorary Consulor
29			Consular Corps, who has been certified by the U. S. State Department,
30			the plate shall bear the words 'Honorary Consular Corps' and
31			a distinguishing number based on the order of issuance.
32		(13)	Judge or Justice Issuable to a sitting or retired judge or justice in

34		(14)	Legislator. – Issuable to a member of the North Carolina General

12		number that reflects the seniority of the member; a plate issued to a
13		commissioned officer shall begin with the number '1'; a plate issued to
14		a noncommissioned officer with a rank of E7, E8, or E9 shall begin
15		with the number '1601'; a plate issued to an enlisted member with a
16		rank of E6 or below shall begin with the number '3001'. The plate
17		issued to a retired or separated member shall indicate the member's
18		retired status.

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1 Sec. 6. Sections 3, 4, and 5 of this act become effective July 1, 1993; Section 2 5 applies to vehicles registered or reregistered on or after that date. The remaining 3 sections of this act are effective upon ratification.

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
