A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE MECKLENBURG COUNTY MANAGER AND
2 THE CHARLOTTE CITY MANAGER TO AWARD CONTRACTS FOR THE
3 PURPOSE OF PURCHASING APPARATUS, SUPPLIES, MATERIALS, OR
4 EQUIPMENT REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT, AND FOR CONSTRUCTION
5 PROJECTS UNDER A CERTAIN AMOUNT, PROVIDED THERE ARE
6 SUFFICIENT APPROPRIATED UNENCUMBERED FUNDS.

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 Section 1. G.S. 143-129 is amended by adding the following at the end:

10 "A county manager may award, approve, and execute contracts for the county for the
11 purchase of apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment regardless of the value of the
12 contract, or for construction contracts where the estimated cost of the construction
13 project does not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), provided that:

14 (1) The county manager shall report to the Board of County
15 Commissioners prior to executing any contract in excess of \$50,000
16 for the purchase of apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment upon
17 which bids were received;

18 (2) The county has approved a sufficient unencumbered appropriation in
19 the annual budget for the current fiscal year for the general purpose
20 specified in the contract or agreement; and

21 (3) The contracts are not entered into as a result of requests for proposals."

22 Sec. 2. Section 9.82 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being Chapter
23 713, Session Laws of 1965, as amended by Chapters 133 and 333, Session Laws of

1 1969 and Chapter 481, Session Laws of 1973, rewritten by Chapter 391, Session Laws
2 of 1979, and amended by Chapter 1140, Session Laws of 1981, Chapter 343, Session
3 Laws of 1985, and Chapter 170, Session Laws of 1989, reads as rewritten:

4 "Sec. 9.82. **Award and approval of certain contracts.** The city manager or his duly
5 authorized designee is hereby authorized to award, approve, and execute contracts or
6 agreements of any kind or nature on behalf of the city when the amount of such contract
7 or agreement does not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000); provided that the city
8 council shall have approved a sufficient appropriation in the annual budget for the
9 current fiscal year for the general purpose specified in the contract or agreement. In
10 addition, the City Manager or his duly authorized designee is authorized to approve and
11 execute amendments to contracts or agreements, including contracts initially approved
12 by the City Council, when the amount in question does not exceed fifty thousand dollars
13 (\$50,000). Furthermore, the City Manager or his duly authorized designee is authorized
14 to award, approve, and execute contracts for the construction and installation of water
15 and sewer lines that will eventually become a part of the City utility system, regardless
16 of the amount, where the construction and installation is the sole responsibility and is at
17 the sole expense of another person, firm, or corporation.

18 Furthermore, the City Manager may award, approve, and execute contracts for the
19 purchase of apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment regardless of the value of the
20 contract, provided that:

21 (1) The City Manager shall report to the City Council prior to executing
22 any contracts upon which bids are received;

23 (2) The City Council shall have approved a sufficient unencumbered
24 appropriation in the annual budget for the current fiscal year for the
25 general purpose specified in the contract;

26 (3) The contract is not a construction contract; and

27 (4) The contracts are not entered into as a result of requests for proposals."

28 Sec. 3. Section 1 of this act applies to Mecklenburg County only.

29 Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
