A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE MAY PROVIDE CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS TO AREA MENTAL HEALTH, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE AUTHORITIES AND THEIR CONTRACT AGENCIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Article 4 of Chapter 114 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 114-19.3. Criminal record checks of personnel of area mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authorities or their contract agencies.

(a) The Department of Justice may provide a criminal record check to the area mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authority of a person who is employed by the area authority or of a person who has applied for employment if the employee or applicant consents to the record check. The information shall be kept confidential by the area authority.

(b) The Department of Justice may provide a criminal record check to the employer of a person who is employed in a contract agency of an area mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authority, or of an area mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authority, if the employee or applicant consents to the record check. For purposes of this subsection, the term 'contract agency' of an area mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authority'

1 means one that is subject to the provisions of Article 4 of Chapter 122C of the General
2 Statutes.

3 (c) The Department of Justice shall charge a reasonable fee for conducting a
4 criminal record check under this section. The fee shall not exceed the actual cost of
5 locating, editing, researching, and retrieving the information.

6 (d) The Department of Justice shall adopt rules to implement this section."
7 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
