A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE FEES AND PER DIEM OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL3 EXAMINERS.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 90-15.1 reads as rewritten:
- 6 "§ 90-15.1. Registration every two years with Board.

7 Every person heretofore or hereafter licensed to practice medicine by said Board of Medical Examiners shall, during the month of January, 1958, and during the month of 8 January in every even-numbered year thereafter, register with the secretary-treasurer of 9 said Board his name and office and residence address and such other information as the 10 Board may deem necessary and shall pay a registration fee fixed by the Board not in 11 excess of one-two hundred dollars (\$100.00). (\$200.00). In the event a physician fails to 12 13 register as herein provided he shall pay an additional amount of twenty dollars (\$20.00) to the Board. Should a physician fail to register and pay the fees imposed, and should 14 such failure continue for a period of 30 days, the license of such physician may be 15 suspended by the Board, after notice and hearing at the next regular meeting of the 16 Board. Upon payment of all fees and penalties which are due, the license of the 17 physician may be reinstated, subject to the Board requiring the physician to appear 18 19 before the Board for an interview and to comply with other licensing requirements." 20 Sec. 2. G.S. 90-15 reads as rewritten:

21 "§ 90-15. License fee; salaries, fees, and expenses of Board.

1 Each applicant for a license by examination shall pay to the treasurer of the Board of 2 Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina a fee which shall be prescribed by 3 said Board in an amount not exceeding the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) plus 4 the cost of test materials before being admitted to the examination. Whenever any 5 license is granted without examination, as authorized in G.S. 90-13, the applicant shall 6 pay to the treasurer of the Board a fee in an amount to be prescribed by the Board not in 7 excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Whenever a limited license is granted as 8 provided in G.S. 90-12, the applicant shall pay to the treasurer of the Board a fee not to 9 exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00), except where a limited license to practice in 10 a medical education and training program approved by the Board for the purpose of education or training is granted, the applicant shall pay a fee of twenty-five dollars 11 12 (\$25.00). A fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid for the issuance of a 13 duplicate license. All fees shall be paid in advance to the treasurer of the Board of 14 Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, to be held by him as a fund for the 15 use of said Board. The compensation and expenses of the members and officers of the 16 said Board and all expenses proper and necessary in the opinion of the Board to the 17 discharge of its duties under and to enforce the laws regulating the practice of medicine 18 or surgery shall be paid out of said fund, upon the warrant of the said Board and all 19 expenses proper and necessary in the opinion of the officers and members of said Board 20 shall be fixed by the Board but shall not exceed one-two hundred dollars (\$100.00) 21 (\$200.00) per day per member for time spent in the performance and discharge of his duties as a member of said Board, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary 22 23 expenses incurred in the performance of his duties as a member of said Board. Any 24 unexpended sum or sums of money remaining in the treasury of said Board at the 25 expiration of the terms of office of the members thereof shall be paid over to their successors in office. 26

For the initial and annual registration of an assistant to a physician, the Board may require the payment of a fee not to exceed a reasonable amount."
