A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ELIMINATE THE ONE-DOLLAR FEE FOR MAIL-IN VEHICLE
REGISTRATION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 20-85.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 20-85.1. Registration by mail; one-day title service; fees.

"(a) The owner of a vehicle registered in North Carolina may renew that vehicle registration by mail. ~~A postage and handling fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per vehicle to be registered shall be charged for this service.~~

(b) The Commissioner and the employees of the Division designated by the Commissioner may prepare and deliver upon request a certificate of title, charging a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for one-day title service, in lieu of the title fee required by G.S. 20-85(a). The fee for one-day title service must be paid by cash or by certified check. The fee collected under this subsection shall be credited to the Highway Trust Fund.

~~(e) The fee collected under subsection (a) shall be credited to the Highway Fund. The fee collected under subsection (b) shall be credited to the Highway Trust Fund."~~

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.
