7	(1)	The duties and powers of the North Carolina Cemetery Commission;
8	(2)	The limitations on the authority and powers of the North Carolina
9		Cemetery Commission to safeguard the investment of consumers in
10		cemetery plots and perpetual care;
11	(3)	The need for additional legislation to protect consumers when a private
12		cemetery ceases operation or is sold to a successor entity;
13	(4)	The need for requiring plats to be filed with the register of deeds of the
14		county where the cemetery is located and the need to keep these plats
15		up-to-date; and
16	(5)	Any other matters related to the regulation and operation of cemeteries
17		in this State.

2	the results of this study, including legislative recommendations, to the 1995 General

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Research Commission the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the 1995-96 fiscal year and the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the 1996-97 fiscal year.

Sec. 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.

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
