2	AN ACT TO CREATE THE WELL CONTRACTORS AND PUMP CONTRACTORS
3	CERTIFICATION COMMISSION, TO AMEND THE WELL DRILLERS AND
4	PUMP INSTALLERS REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS, AND TO MAKE
5	VARIOUS AMENDMENTS TO THE WELL CONSTRUCTION ACT, AS
6	RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. Article 7 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by
9	adding a new Part to read:
10	"Part 9A. Well Contractors and Pump Contractors Certification Commission.
11	" <u>§ 143B-301.10. Definitions.</u>
12	The definitions in G.S. 87-85 and G.S. 87-98.2 apply in this Part.
13	"§ 143B-301.11. Creation, powers, and duties of the Commission.
14	(a) <u>Creation and Duties. – The Well Contractors and Pump Contractors</u>
15	Certification Commission is created within the Department. The Commission shall:
16	(1) Adopt rules with respect to the certification of well contractors and
17	pump contractors as provided by Article 7A of Chapter 87 of the
18	General Statutes.
19	(2) Exercise quasi-judicial powers in accordance with the provisions of
20	Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. The Commission shall make the

12		intments The Commission shall consist of seven members appointed
13	by the Governor	r, with the following qualifications:
14	<u>(1)</u>	One member who is engaged in well contractor activities, who is
15		certified as a well contractor under Article 7A of Chapter 87 of the
16		General Statutes, and who is engaged primarily in the construction,
17		installation, repair, alteration, or abandonment of domestic water supply
18		wells.
19	<u>(2)</u>	One member who is engaged in well contractor activities, who is
20		certified as a well contractor under Article 7A of Chapter 87 of the
21		General Statutes, and who is engaged primarily in the construction,
22		installation, repair, alteration, or abandonment of industrial, municipal,
23		or other large capacity water supply wells.
24	<u>(3)</u>	One member who is engaged in well contractor activities, who is
25		certified as a well contractor under Article 7A of Chapter 87 of the
26		General Statutes, and who is engaged primarily in the construction,
27		installation, repair, alteration, or abandonment of nonwater supply
28		wells, such as monitoring or recovery wells.
29	(4)	One member who is certified as a pump contractor under Article 7A of
30		Chapter 87 of the General Statutes and who is not engaged in well
31		contractor activities.
32	<u>(5)</u>	One member who is employed by a local county health department that
33		is located east of or is traversed by Interstate 95 and who is actively
34		engaged in well inspection and permitting.
35	<u>(6)</u>	One member who is employed by a local county health department that
36		is located wholly west of Interstate 95 and who is actively engaged in
37		well inspection and permitting.
38	<u>(7)</u>	One member of the public at large who is not engaged in the activities
39		of a well contractor or a pump contractor and who is not an employee of
40		either a business or firm engaged in well or pump contractor activities
41		or a State or county governmental agency.
42	(b) Addit	ional Qualifications. – Appointment of members to fill positions (1), (2),
43		be made from among all those persons who are recommended to the

1	Governor for appointment to the Commission by any person who is engaged in well
2	contractor activities and who is certified as a well contractor under Article 7A of Chapter
3	87 of the General Statutes. Of the three members appointed to fill positions (1), (2), (3),
4	one shall be a resident of a county that is located east of or is traversed by Interstate 95,
5	and two shall be residents of a county that is located wholly west of Interstate 95. None
6	of these three shall reside or have their primary place of business in the same county or in
7	contiguous counties.
8	(c) Terms. – Appointments to the Commission shall be for terms of three years.
9	The terms of members appointed to fill positions (1), (4), and (7) shall expire on 30 June
10	of years evenly divisible by three. The terms of members appointed to fill positions (2)
11	and (5) shall expire on 30 June of years that follow by one year those years that are
12	evenly divisible by three. The terms of members appointed to fill positions (3) and (6)
13	shall expire on 30 June of years that precede by one year those years that are evenly
14	divisible by three. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed and
15	qualified. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.
16	(d) Officers. – The Commission shall elect a Chairperson and a Vice-chairperson
17	from among its members. These officers shall serve from the time of their election until
18	30 June of the following year, or until a successor is elected.
19	(e) <u>Vacancies. – An appointment to fill a vacancy on the Commission created by</u>
20	the resignation, dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the
21	unexpired term.
22	(f) Continuing Education. – During a member's term on the Commission, the
23	member shall meet the annual continuing education requirements set for certified well
24	contractors and certified pump contractors. This requirement applies regardless of
25	whether the member is a certified well contractor or a certified pump contractor.
26	(g) <u>Removal. – The Governor may remove any member of the Commission from</u>
27	office for misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance.
28	(h) <u>Compensation. – The members of the Commission shall receive per diem and</u>
29	necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-
30	<u>5.</u>
31	(i) Quorum. – A majority of the membership of the Commission constitutes a
32	quorum for the transaction of business.
33	(j) Services. – All clerical and other services required by the Commission shall be
34	supplied by the Secretary."

24	civil penalty of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each violation, as
25	determined by the Secretary of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources. Each day
26	of a continuing violation shall be considered a separate offense. No person shall be
27	subject to a penalty who did not directly commit the violation or cause it to be
28	committed.
29	(b) No penalty shall be assessed until the person alleged to be in violation has
30	been:
31	(1) Notified of the violation in accordance with the notice provisions set out
32	in G.S. 87-91(a),
33	(2) Informed by said notice of remedial action, which if taken within 30
34	days from receipt of the notice, will effect compliance with this Article
35	and the regulations under it, and
36	(3) Warned by said notice that a civil penalty can be assessed for failure to
37	comply within the specified time.
38	(c) In determining the amount of the penalty the Secretary shall consider factors
39	set out in G.S. 143B-282.1(b). The procedures set out in G.S. 143-215.6 and G.S. 143B-
40	282.1 shall apply to civil penalties assessed under this section.
41	(d) The Secretary shall notify any person assessed a civil penalty of the assessment
42	and the specific reasons therefor by registered or certified mail, or by any means
43	authorized by G.S. 1A-1, Rule 4.

2 has been served on the violator, the Secretary shall request the Attorney General to 3 institute a civil action in the Superior Court of any county in which the violator resides or 4 has his or its principal place of business to recover the amount of the assessment, unless 5 the violator contests the assessment or requests remission of the assessment in whole or 6 in part. If any civil penalty has not been paid within 30 days after the final agency 7 decision or court order has been served on the violator, the Secretary shall request the 8 Attorney General to institute a civil action in the Superior Court of any county in which 9 the violator resides or has his or its principal place of business to recover the amount of 10 the assessment.

- Sec. 4. G.S. 87-85(14) reads as rewritten:
- 15 "(14) 'Well' means any excavation that is cored, bored, drilled, jetted, dug or otherwise constructed for the purpose of locating, testing or 16 17 withdrawing groundwater or for evaluating, testing, developing, 18 draining or recharging any groundwater reservoirs or aquifer, or that may control, divert, or otherwise cause the movement of water from or 19 20 into any aquifer. Provided, however, this shall not include a well 21 constructed by an individual on land which is owned or leased by him, 22 appurtenant to a single-family dwelling, and intended for domestic use 23 (including household purposes, farm livestock, or gardens)."
- Sec. 5. G.S. 143-355(e) reads as rewritten: 24

Registration with Department Required; Registration Periods. - Every person, 25 "(e) 26 firm or corporation engaged in the business of drilling, boring, coring or constructing wells in any manner with the use of power machinery in this State, State or engaged in the 27 business of installing or repairing pumps or pumping equipment shall register annually 28 29 with the Department on forms to be furnished by the said Department. The registration 30 required hereby shall be made during the period from January 1 to January 31 of each year. Registration fees collected under this section shall be credited to the Well 31 32 Construction Fund created by G.S. 87-98.13."

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Sec. 6. G.S. 143-355(e) is repealed. Sec. 7. G.S. 87-91(b) is repealed.

35 Sec. 8. To provide for staggered terms, initial appointments by the Governor 36 to the Well Contractors and Pump Contractors Certification Commission created in 37 Section 1 of this act shall be as follows:

- 38 Initial appointments to positions (1), (4), and (7) shall expire on 30 June (1)39 1998.
- 40 (2)Initial appointments to positions (2) and (5) shall expire on 30 June 41 1999.
- 42 (3) Initial appointments to positions (3) and (6) shall expire on 30 June 43 2000

1 Sec. 9. Section 6 of this act becomes effective 1 July 1997. The remainder of 2 this act is effective upon ratification.
