2	AN ACT	TO ALLOW LEFT TURNS ON RED IN CERTAIN SITUATIONS.
3	The Gene	eral Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4		Section 1. G.S. 20-158(b) reads as rewritten:
5	"(b)	Control of Vehicles at Intersections. –
6		(1) When a stop sign has been erected or installed at an intersection, it shall
7		be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail to stop in obedience
8		thereto and yield the right-of-way to vehicles operating on the
9		designated main-traveled or through highway. When stop signs have
10		been erected at three or more entrances to an intersection, the driver,
11		after stopping in obedience thereto, may proceed with caution.
12		(2) Vehicles facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight through an
13		intersection from a steady or strobe beam stoplight shall not enter the
14		intersection while the steady or strobe beam stoplight is emitting a red
15		light controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection; provided
16		that, provided:
17		<u>a.</u> <u>except Except</u> where prohibited by an appropriate sign, vehicular
18		traffic facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight
19		through an intersection, after coming to a complete stop at the
20		intersection, may enter the intersection to make a right turn but

4	b. Except where prohibited by an appropriate sign, vehicular traffi

12	When the stoplight is emitting a steady yellow circular light on a traffi
13	signal controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection or
14	steady yellow arrow light on a traffic signal controlling traffic turning a
15	an intersection, vehicles facing the yellow light are warned that th
16	related green light is being terminated or a red light will be immediatel
17	forthcoming. When the stoplight is emitting a steady green ligh
18	vehicles may proceed with due care through the intersection subject t
19	the rights of pedestrians and other vehicles as may otherwise b
20	provided by law.
21	(3) When a flashing red light has been erected or installed at an intersection
22	approaching vehicles facing the red light shall stop and yield the right
23	of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. The right t
24	proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable to making a stop at
25	stop sign.
26	(4) When a flashing yellow light has been erected or installed at a
27	intersection, approaching vehicles facing the yellow flashing light ma
28	proceed through the intersection with caution, without stopping
29	yielding the right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection.
30	(5) When a stop sign, stoplight, flashing light, or other traffic-control devic
31	authorized by subsection (a) of this section requires a vehicle to stop a
32	an intersection, the driver shall stop at (i) an appropriately marked sto
33	line, or if none, (ii) before entering a marked crosswalk, or if none, (iii)
34	before entering the intersection at the point nearest the intersectin
35	street where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on th
36	intersecting street."
37	Sec. 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1995.
