A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR SUPPLEMENTS FOR TEACHERS IN FACILITIES OPERATED BY THE DIVISION OF YOUTH SERVICES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S 126-5(c3) reads as rewritten:

"(c3) Except as to the policies, rules, and plans established by the Commission pursuant to G.S. 126-4(5) and the provisions of Article 6 of this Chapter, the provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to: Teaching and related educational classes of employees of the Department of Correction, the Department of Human Resources, and any other State department, agency or institution, whose salaries shall be set in the same manner as set for corresponding public school employees in accordance with Chapter 115C of the General Statutes. Teaching and related education classes of employees regional juvenile detention centers and training schools operated by the Department of Human Resources, Division of Youth Services, shall also receive an annual supplement equal to the greater of (i) the local supplement paid to teachers in the local school administrative unit in which the facility is located and (ii) the average of the local supplements in all local school administrative units in which the facilities are located. For the purpose of this subsection, the local supplement paid to teachers in a local school administrative unit is the most recent amount reported by the unit to the State Board of Education."

1           Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
2 Human Resources the sum of one hundred sixty-two thousand dollars (\$162,000) for the  
3 1995-96 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred sixty-two thousand dollars (\$162,000)  
4 for the 1996-97 fiscal year to implement Section 1 of this act.

5           Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
