2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE MAY PROVIDE
3	CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS TO HOME CARE AGENCIES AND HOSPICES.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 114-19.3 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 114-19.3. Criminal record checks of personnel of hospitals, nursing homes, home
7	care agencies, hospices, and area mental health, developmental disabilities,
8	and substance abuse authorities and their contract agencies.
9	The Department of Justice may provide a criminal record check to a hospital or
10	nursing home hospital, nursing home, home care agency, or hospice licensed under
11	Chapter 131E of the General Statutes and to a hospital or an area mental health,
12	developmental disabilities, and substance abuse authority licensed under Chapter 122C of
13	the General Statutes, including a contract agency of an area authority that is subject to the
14	provisions of Article 4 of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes, of an individual who is
15	employed by the hospital, nursing home, home care agency, hospice, area authority, or
16	contract agency or of an individual who has applied for employment with the hospital,
17	nursing home, home care agency, hospice, area authority, or contract agency if the
18	employee or applicant consents to the record check. The information shall be kept
19	confidential by the hospital, nursing home, home care agency, hospice, area authority, or
20	contract agency that received the information. Upon the disclosure of confidential

information under this section by a hospital, nursing home, <u>home care agency</u>, <u>hospice</u>,
area authority, or contract agency, the Department may refuse to provide further criminal
record checks to the hospital, nursing home, <u>home care agency</u>, <u>hospice</u>, area authority,
or contract agency. The Department shall charge a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for
conducting a criminal record check under this section."

6 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1995, and applies to checks done 7 on or after that date.
