the United State (1)	While on duty or within any period of time during which the employee is expected to perform services for which the employee receives compensation from the State, no public school employee shall take any active part in managing a campaign, or campaign for political office, or otherwise engage in political activity; and
<u>(2)</u>	Unless in an approved curriculum, no public school employee shall otherwise use State funds, supplies, or vehicles to secure support for or oppose any candidate, party, or issue in an election involving candidates for office or party nominations, or affect the results thereof.

- 1 2 employee exercising supervisory authority shall make, issue, or enforce any rule or policy 3 the effect of which is to interfere with the right of any public school employee as an 4 individual to engage in political activity while not on duty or at times during which the 5 employee is not performing services for which the employee receives compensation from 6 the State or a unit of local government. A public school employee who is on call or may 7 be expected to perform job duties on a 24-hour-per-day basis shall not be prevented from 8 engaging in political activity except during regularly scheduled working hours or at other
