BILL SUMMARY: "TO PROVIDE A PROCEDURE FOR ELIMINATING FRIVOLOUS LAWSUITS BY PRISONERS AND TO ESTABLISH A PARTIAL FILING FEE FOR PRISONERS PROCEEDING AS INDIGENTS." Amends G.S. 1-110 to provide separate procedure for pro se suits filed by prison inmates. Initially, judge to determine if suit is frivolous and to dismiss it by order if judge so finds. If suit not determined frivolous, cases returned to clerk of superior court for inquiry into inmate's ability to pay filing fee. Permits inmate to proceed as indigent upon payment or partial filing fee based upon 15% of income received in inmate's trust account during six-months before filing of complaint. If fee is not received within 20 days of notice of amount, suit to be dismissed.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Effective for actions filed on or after ratification.
