ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: Language in this bill is permissive, not mandatory, in nature. Currently, the Forsyth County detention center is county-operated (vs. state-operated). G.S. 134A-38 requires the state and the county to share equally in the operating costs of detention. This bill does not obligate the state to share in future capital costs with Forsyth County if the county chooses to modify an adult jail to meet the conditions stipulated in this bill for housing juveniles within that jail.
