A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH PILOT PROGRAMS IN WAKE AND ROCKINGHAM COUNTIES IN THE OFFICE OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR THE COLLECTION OF WORTHLESS CHECKS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The district attorneys' offices in both Wake County and Rockingham County may each develop and implement a pilot program within the district attorney's office for the collection of worthless checks. The program may be part of the deferred prosecution program.

The purposes of the program are to assist worthless check victims in recovering restitution, to decrease the amount of time spent in prosecuting worthless check cases and so better use criminal justice resources, and to require the offender to assist in covering the cost of collecting the worthless check.

Section 2. A fee of up to sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) to cover the investigative and administrative costs of the collecting on the worthless check may be assessed by the district attorney's office against any check passer of a worthless check if the acceptor agrees to allow the check to be collected pursuant to the pilot program. The fee shall be paid to the clerk of court. The fees collected under the pilot program shall be remitted to the district attorney's office to be used for the pilot program.

Section 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 1997.
