A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ASSIST WITH THE RELOCATION OF

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ASSIST WITH THE RELOCATION OF THREATENED STRUCTURES AND TO ACQUIRE COASTAL SHORELINE PROPERTY RENDERED UNBUILDABLE UNDER CAMA RULES BY BEACH EROSION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to be allocated as follows:

- (1) \$5,000,000 to be used to assist with the relocation of structures along the State's shoreline that violate CAMA setback lines.
- (2) \$5,000,000 to be used to acquire property that is not "buildable"under CAMA rules and guidelines as a result of beach erosion.

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1998.
