Section 1. Section 27.3 of Chapter 18 of the Session Laws of the 1996 Second Extra Session reads as rewritten:

"Sec. 27.3. Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources in this act, the sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) for the 1996-97 fiscal year shall be transferred to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina for the North Carolina Agricultural Research Service at North Carolina State University to conduct research into economically feasible odor control technologies and to provide detailed economic analysis of odor management alternatives; provided these funds are matched with an equal sum from private sources. alternatives. No later than January 1, 1997, the Board of Governors shall report to the Environmental Review Commission and the Fiscal Research Division on progress under the research, including any findings and recommendations at that time."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
