## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM RAFFLE CASH PRIZES AND THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF RAFFLE MERCHANDISE PRIZES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:Section 1. G.S. 14-309.15(d) reads as rewritten:
"(d) The maximum cash prize that may be offered or paid for any one raffle is five theusand dollars $(\$ 5,000)$-ten thousand dollars $(\$ 10,000)$ and if merchandise is used as a prize, and it is not redeemable for cash, the maximum fair market value of that prize may be fwenty five thousand dollars $(\$ 25,000)$.-fifty thousand dollars $(\$ 50,000)$. No real property may be offered as a prize in a raffle. The total cash prizes offered or paid may not exceed ten thousand dollars $(\$ 10,000)$ in any calendar year. The total fair market value of all prizes offered, either in cash or in merchandise that is not redeemable for cash, may not exceed fifty thousand dollars $(\$ 50,000)$ in any calendar year."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
