February 27, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT NEW MOTOR VEHICLES NEED BE INSPECTED 3 ONLY WHEN THEY ARE SOLD TO THE FIRST PURCHASER. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 Section 1. G.S. 20-183.4C reads as rewritten: 6 "§ 20-183.4C. When a vehicle must be inspected. 7 A vehicle that is subject to a safety inspection, an emissions inspection, or both must 8 be inspected as follows: 9 A new vehicle must be inspected before it is offered for sale sold at retail (1) 10 in this State. A used vehicle must be inspected before it is offered for sale at retail in 11 (2) 12 this State by a dealer at a location other than a public auction. A used vehicle that is offered for sale at retail in this State by a dealer at 13 (3) a public auction must be inspected before it is offered for sale unless it 14 has an inspection sticker that was put on the vehicle under this Part and 15 does not expire until at least nine months after the date the vehicle is 16 offered for sale at auction. 17 A used vehicle acquired by a resident of this State from a person outside 18 (4) 19 the State must be inspected within 10 days after the vehicle is registered

}		to be inspected sooner."
