A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOUR-YEAR TERMS FOR THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL
2 OF THE TOWN OF STONEVILLE.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. Section 3 of the Charter of the Town of Stoneville, being Chapter
5 287 of the 1983 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

6 "Sec. 3. Term of Office of Members of Council. Members of the Council are elected
7 to ~~two-year~~ four-year terms. In 1997, the three persons receiving the highest numbers of
8 votes are elected to four-year terms and the two persons receiving the next highest
9 numbers of votes are elected to two-year terms. In 1999 and quadrennially thereafter,
10 two persons are elected to four-year terms. In 2001 and quadrennially thereafter, three
11 persons are elected to four-year terms."

12 Section 2. Section 4 of the Charter of the Town of Stoneville, being Chapter
13 287 of the 1983 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

14 "Sec. 4. Election of Mayor, Term of Office. The qualified voters of the entire Town
15 elect the Mayor, who shall be elected to a ~~two-year~~ four-year term of office."

16 Section 3. This act applies beginning with persons elected in 1997.

17 Section 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
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
