| 24 | Every person issued a certificate under this Article shall display the certificate |
| 25 | prominently in the assisted living residence where the person works. |
| 26 | " <u>§ 90-288.18. Adverse action on a certificate.</u> |
| 27 | (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, the Department shall have the |
| 28 | authority to deny a new or renewal application for a certificate, and to amend, recall, |
| 29 | suspend, or revoke an existing certificate upon a determination that there has been a |
| 30 | substantial failure to comply with the provisions of this Article or any rules promulgated |
| 31 | under this Article. |
| 32 | (b) The provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes shall govern all |

| 1 | A person who serves as an assisted living administrator without first obtaining a |

| 2 | certificate from the Department is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Each act of unlawful |
| 3 | practice constitutes a distinct and separate offense." |
| 4 | Section 2. G.S. 131D-2(a)(1b) reads as rewritten: |
| 5 | "(1b) "Adult care home" is an assisted living residence in which the housing |
| 6 | management provides 24-hour scheduled and unscheduled personal care |
| 7 | services to two or more residents, either directly or, for scheduled needs, |
| 8 | through formal written agreement with licensed home care or hospice |
| 9 | agencies. Some licensed adult care homes provide supervision to |
| 10 | persons with cognitive impairments whose decisions, if made |
| 11 | independently, may jeopardize the safety or well-being of themselves or |
| 12 | others and therefore require supervision. Medication in an adult care |
| 13 | home may be administered by designated, trained staff. Adult care |
| 14 | homes that provide care to two to six unrelated residents are commonly |
| 15 | called family care homes. Adult care homes and family care homes are |
| 16 | subject to licensure by the Division of Facility Services." |
| 17 | Section 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 90-288.14, as enacted in |
| 18 | Section 1 of this act, the Department shall prior to December 31, 1999, grant a certificate |
| 19 | to practice as an assisted living administrator to a person who has been actively engaged |
| 20 | as an assisted living administrator in this State for at least one year. Any person who has |
| 21 | been actively engaged as an assisted living administrator for less than one year shall |
| 22 | satisfactorily complete a written exam administered by the Department before issuance of |
| 23 | a license. The Department may refuse to certify a person as an assisted living |
| 24 | administrator if the person's compliance history review shows a pattern of noncompliance |
| 25 | with State law or otherwise demonstrates disregard for the health safety, and welfare of |
| 26 | residents in current or past facilities where the person has worked as an assisted living |
| 27 | administrator. |
| 28 | Section 4. This act becomes effective January 1, 2000. |
