6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Subsection (d) of Section 18.22 of S.L. 1997-443, as amended by
8	Section 16.3 of S.L. 1998-212 and Section 17.7 of S.L. 1999-237, reads as rewritten:
9	"(d) This act applies only to Brunswick, Bladen, Columbus, <u>Cumberland</u> , Durham,
10	New Hanover, Pender, Rockingham, and Wake Counties."
11	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative
12	Office of the Courts the sum of one hundred twelve thousand eight hundred forty-nine
13	dollars (\$112,849) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year and the sum of ninety-six thousand one
14	hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$96,137) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year for one district
15	attorney investigator position, one district attorney legal assistant position, and special
16	equipment and related costs to expand the worthless check program to Cumberland
17	County.
18	Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative
19	Office of the Courts the sum of one hundred eighty-six thousand five hundred fifty-four

dollars (\$186,554) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred fifty-six 20

- 1 thousand five hundred sixty-four dollars (\$156,564) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year for
- 2 information technology costs to provide one business systems analyst position, computer
- 3 application enhancement, and ongoing technical support for the worthless check program
- 4 in all nine counties.5 Section 4.
