SESSION LAW 2000-73
SENATE BILL 1318

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT AN ENTERPRISE TIER TWO AREA MAY NOT BE REDESIGNATED AS A HIGHER-NUMBERED TIER AREA UNTIL IT HAS BEEN AN ENTERPRISE TIER TWO AREA FOR TWO CONSECUTIVE YEARS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 105-129.3(c) reads as rewritten:

"(c) Exception for Enterprise Tier One and Two Areas. – Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a county designated as an enterprise tier one area or an enterprise tier two area may not be redesignated as a higher-numbered enterprise tier area until it has been ~~an~~ in its enterprise tier ~~one~~ area for at least two consecutive years."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and, notwithstanding G.S. 105-129.3(b), applies retroactively to designations for the 2000 and later calendar years.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 30th day of June, 2000.
