2	AN ACT TO ENACT THE COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY COLLEGE			
3	IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 1999.			
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	Section 1. This act shall be known as "The Comprehensive Community			
6	College Improvement Act of 1999."			
7	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of			
8	Community Colleges the sum of one hundred thirty-one million eight hundred thousand			
9	dollars (\$131,800,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred thirty-			
10	one million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$131,800,000) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year.			
11	For each year of the biennium, these funds shall be used as follows:			
12	(1) \$22,300,000 shall be used to provide full funding for enrollment growth			
13	in curriculum, continuing education, and basic skills programs of			
14	instruction.			
15	(2) \$52,800,000 shall be used to provide additional full-time faculty and			
16	instructional support staff positions, and to adequately compensate the			
17	professionals who deliver instruction and assistance to adult learners.			
18	(3) \$10,000,000 shall be used to provide critical instructional materials for			
19	classroom and lab support, including supplies, printing, publications,			
20	instructional software, and other instructional aids.			

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1	(4)	\$15,800,000 shall be used to provide enhanced training opportunities
2		for those seeking to either upgrade their existing job skills or obtain new
3		job skills.
4	(5)	\$5,300,000 shall be used to provide basic skills instruction, including
5		English as a second language, to all citizens in need of these skills.
6	(6)	\$25,600,000 shall be used to provide for a comprehensive Management
7		Information System designed to monitor the performance of students,
8		serve as a management, planning, and evaluation tool, and provide
9		accountability for State funds.
10	Sectio	n 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
