**BILL SUMMARY:** DMV will make permanent registration plates available to nationally chartered charitable organizations, at a fee of \$6.00, for all trailers that are used only for parade floats and for transporting vehicles and structures used only in parades.

**ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:** The Shriners appear to be the major organization that would be affected by this legislation and the three main Temples in North Carolina have a total of approximately 38 trailers that would qualify. For these trailers the annual fee of \$10 would become a one time fee of \$6. The loss in revenue would be \$4 per trailer in the first year and \$10 per trailer in subsequent years.
