	(2) <u>Determining the tribe's citizenship, including e</u>	stablishing criteria for	
	tribal enrollment and maintaining a tribal roll;		
	(3) Electing the tribe's governing body;		
	(4) Exercising legislative, executive, and judicial	_	
	within the tribe's jurisdiction, including exercise		
	the citizens of the tribe with respect to tribal affa		
	(5) Protecting and promoting the health and welfa		
	citizens, including implementing and administ	ering social, cultural,

	(6) Authorizing tribal officials to represent the tri
