2	AN ACT TO SPECIFY THE MINIMUM SEPARATION DISTANCES BETWEEN A		
3	WELL SERVING CERTAIN SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLINGS AND CERTAIN		
4	OTHER STRUCTURES ON THE SAME LOT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE		
5	ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO ADOPT A		
6	TEMPORARY RULE TO INCORPORATE THOSE MINIMUM SEPARATION		
7	DISTANCES.		
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
9	SECTION 1. For a well serving a single-family dwelling where lot size or		
10	other fixed conditions preclude the separation distances specified in subparagraph (a)(2)		
11	of 15A NCAC 2C .0107 (Standards of Construction: Water-Supply Wells), as adopted		
12	by the Environmental Management Commission on October 12, 2000, and approved by		
13	the Rules Review Commission on November 16, 2000, the required separation distances		
14	shall be the maximum possible, but shall in no case be less than the following:		
15	(1) Septic tank and drainfield 50 feet		
16	(2) Water-tight sewage or liquid-waste collection		
17	or transfer facility 25 feet		
18	(3) Animal barns 50 feet		
19	(4) Cesspool or privies 50 feet.		
20	SECTION 2. This act constitutes a recent act of the General Assembly		
21	within the meaning of G.S. 150B-21.1(a). The Environmental Management		
22	Commission may adopt a temporary rule that incorporates the provisions of Section 1 of		
23	this act. Notwithstanding G.S. 150B-21.1(d), a temporary rule adopted in accordance		
24	with this section shall remain in effect until a permanent rule adopted to replace the		
25	temporary rule becomes effective.		
26	SECTION 3. Except as provided by Section 1 of this act, this act does not		
27	limit the authority of the Environmental Management Commission to adopt rules		

27 limit the authority of the Environmental Management Commission to adopt rules
28 governing the location, construction, repair, and abandonment of wells pursuant to G.S.
29 87-87 and Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

1 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective retroactively to the date on which it is 2 ratified. If the Environmental Management Commission adopts a temporary rule as 3 provided in Section 2 of this act, Section 1 of this act expires when the temporary rule 4 becomes effective.
