8	(a) Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device. – As defined in G.S.
9	<u>20-4.01(7a).</u>
10	(b) Exempt From Registration. – As provided in G.S. 20-51.
11	(c) Use of Device. – An electric personal assistive mobility device may be
12	operated on public highways with posted speeds of 25 miles per hour or less, sidewalks,
13	and bicycle paths. A person operating an electric personal assistive mobility device on a
14	sidewalk, roadway, or bicycle path shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and other
15	human-powered devices. A person operating an electric personal assistive mobility
16	device shall have all rights and duties of a pedestrian."
