The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 116-31.10 reads as rewritten:	
"§ 116-31.10. Powers of Board regarding certain purchasing contracts.	
(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 143-53.1 or G.S. 143-53(a)(2), the example of the control of the contro	xpenditure
benchmark for a special responsibility constituent institution with regard to co	ompetitive
bid procedures and the bid value benchmark shall be an amount not greater	
hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000). five hundred thousand dollars (\$250,000).	
The Board shall set the benchmark for each institution from time to time. In	_
institution's benchmark in accordance with this section, the Board shall co	
institution's overall capabilities including staff resources, purchasing co	•
reviews, and audit reports. The Board shall also consult with the Direct	
Division of Purchase and Contract and the Director of the Budget prior to	setting the
benchmark.	
(b) Each institution with an expenditure benchmark greater than two	
fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) shall comply with this subsection for any	
greater than two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) but not greater	
hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000). This institution shall submit to the D	
Purchase and Contract for that Division's approval or other action deemed need	
the Division a copy of all offers received and the institution's recommendation	
or other action. Notice of the Division's decision shall be sent to that institu	
institution shall then proceed with the award of contract or other action reco	mmended
by the Division."	

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
