4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-81 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
6	"(i) The State Board of Education shall adopt a consumer education curriculum
7	for grades 9 through 12 and shall specify the minimum amount of instructional time that
8	shall be devoted to it. Topics covered in the curriculum shall include, but not be limited
9	to, installment purchasing, budgeting, investing, banking, bank lending practices,
10	comparisons between conventional and sub-prime lending sources, consumer credit
11	issues, comparisons of prices, and an understanding of the consumer's role in
12	formulating and achieving the goals of the mixed free enterprise system through the
13	consumer's interaction with agriculture, business, labor unions, and government."
14	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies
15	beginning with the 2003-2004 school year.
