6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 90-652 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 90-652. Powers and duties of the Board.
9	The Board shall have the power and duty to:
10	(1) Determine the qualifications and fitness of applicants for licensure,
11	renewal of licensure, and reciprocal licensure. The Board shall, in its
12	discretion, investigate the background of an applicant to determine the
13	applicant's qualifications with due regard given to the applicant's
14	competency, honesty, truthfulness, and integrity. The Department of
15	Justice may provide a criminal record check to the Board for a person
16	who has applied for a license through the Board. The Board shall
17	provide to the Department of Justice, along with the request, the
18	fingerprints of the applicant, any additional information required by
19	the Department of Justice, and a form signed by the applicant
20	consenting to the check of the criminal record and to the use of the
21	fingerprints and other identifying information required by the State or
22	national repositories. The applicant's fingerprints shall be forwarded to
23	the State Bureau of Investigation for a search of the State's criminal
24	history record file, and the State Bureau of Investigation shall forward
25	a set of the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a
26	national criminal history check. The Board shall keep all information
27	pursuant to this subdivision privileged, in accordance with applicable

11	(5)	Conduct investigations, subpoena individuals and records, and do all
12		other things necessary and proper to discipline persons licensed under
13		this Article and to enforce this Article.
14	(6)	Employ professional, clerical, investigative, or special personnel
15		necessary to carry out the provisions of this Article and purchase or
16		rent office space, equipment, and supplies.
17	(7)	Adopt a seal by which it shall authenticate its proceedings, official
18		records, and licenses.
19	(8)	Conduct administrative hearings in accordance with Article 3A of
20	. ,	Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.
21	(9)	Establish certain reasonable fees as authorized by this Article for
22		applications for examination, licensure, provisional licensure, renewal
23		of licensure, and other services provided by the Board.
24	(10)	Submit an annual report to the North Carolina Medical Board, the
25		North Carolina Hospital Association, the North Carolina Society of
26		Respiratory Care, the Governor, and the General Assembly of all the
27		Board's official actions during the preceding year, together with any
28		recommendations and findings regarding improvements of the practice
29		of respiratory care.
