The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
SECTION 1. Article 54B of Chapter 14 of the General Stat	cutes is amended
by adding a new section to read:	
"§ 14-415.24. Reciprocity; out-of-state handgun permits.	
(a) A valid concealed handgun permit or license issued by anoth	ner state is valid
in North Carolina if that state grants the same right to residents of Nor	
have valid concealed handgun permits issued pursuant to this Article in	their possession
while carrying concealed weapons in that state.	
(b) The Attorney General shall maintain a registry of states	that meet the
requirements of this section on the North Carolina Criminal Information	on Network and
make the registry available to law enforcement officers for investigative	purposes.
(c) Every 12 months after the effective date of this subsection, th	e Department of
Justice shall make written inquiry of the concealed handgun permittir	ng authorities in
each other state as to: (i) whether a North Carolina resident may ca	rry a concealed
handgun in their state based upon having a valid North Carolina con	
permit and (ii) whether a North Carolina resident may apply for a cor	
permit in that state based upon having a valid North Carolina con	cealed handgun
permit. The Department of Justice shall attempt to secure from each stat	_
North Carolina residents who hold a valid North Carolina concealed ha	•
carry a concealed handgun in that state, either on the basis of the North	
or on the basis that the North Carolina permit is sufficient to permit the	he issuance of a
similar license or permit by the other state."	
SECTION 2 G S 1/1 260(a1) reads as rewritten:	

"(a1) It shall be unlawful for any person willfully and intentionally to carry

concealed about his person any pistol or gun except in the following circumstances:

1	(1) The person is on the person's own premises.
2	(2) The deadly weapon is a handgun, and the person has a concealed
3	handgun permit issued in accordance with Article 54B of this Chapter.
