<u>following:</u>	
<u>(1)</u>	Thousands of citizens in the State have disabilities, including blindness
	or visual impairment, that prevent them from using conventional print
(2)	material.
<u>(2)</u>	The State fulfills an important responsibility by providing books and
	magazines prepared in Braille, audio, and large-type formats made
(2)	available to eligible blind and disabled persons.
<u>(3)</u>	The technology, transcription methods, and means of distribution used
	for these materials are labor-intensive and cannot support rapid
	dissemination to individuals in rural and urban areas throughout the State.
<u>(4)</u>	Lack of direct and prompt access to information included in
<u>(4)</u>	newspapers, magazines, newsletters, schedules, announcements, or
	other time-sensitive materials limits literacy, participation, and
	educational opportunities for blind and disabled persons.
<u>(5)</u>	This limitation can best be overcome through use of high-speed

computer and telecommunications technology, combined with

1		customized software, that provides a practical and cost-effective means
2		to convert electronic text-based information, including daily
3		newspapers, into synthetic speech suitable for statewide distribution
4		with modern telecommunications technology.
5	<u>(6)</u>	Low-cost interstate telecommunications rates make distribution of
6		electronic text-based information to eligible users both efficient and
7		cost-effective for the State.
8	<u>(7)</u>	Federal funds have been used to develop the technology and
9		infrastructure needed for statewide toll-free access to daily newspapers
10		and other timely information of local, State, and national interest
11		through a service known as NFB-NEWSLINE®, providing an efficient
12		and cost-effective means of reader registration, content acquisition,
13		and interstate telecommunications support.
14	<u>(8)</u>	Use of this accessible electronic information service will enhance the
15		State's current efforts to meet the needs of blind and disabled citizens
16		for access to information that is otherwise available in print, thereby
17		reducing isolation and supporting full integration and equal access for
18		these individuals.
19	(c) Defin	nitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:
20	<u>(1)</u>	Accessible electronic information service. – A service where news and
21		other timely information, including newspapers, is provided to eligible
22		individuals from a multistate service center, using high-speed
23		computers and telecommunications technology for interstate
24		acquisition of content and rapid distribution in a form appropriate for
25		use by blind and disabled persons.
26	<u>(2)</u>	Blind and disabled persons Those individuals who are eligible for
27		library loan services through the Library of Congress and the State
28		Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped pursuant to 36
29		C.F.R. § 701.10(b).
30	<u>(3)</u>	Director The Director of the Division of Services for the Blind in
31		the Department of Health and Human Resources.
32	<u>(4)</u>	Qualified entity An agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision
33		of the State or a nonprofit organization that:
34		a. Provides interstate access for eligible persons to read daily
35		newspapers producing audio editions by computer.
36		b. Provides a means of program administration or reader
37		registration on the Internet.
38	(d) Admi	inistration of Service The Division of Services for the Blind shall
39	administer the	statewide accessible electronic information service, including its
40	establishment,	operation, and promotion. The Director of the Division of Services for
41	the Blind shall	enter into an agreement with a qualified entity to provide an accessible
42	electronic infor	mation service for eligible blind and disabled persons. The Division of
43	Services for the	e Blind shall plan for continuation of the service from year to year and

- support from appropriate programs and securing access to low-cost interstate rates for telecommunications by reimbursement or otherwise.
- (e) Accessible Electronic Information Service Fund. In order to support an accessible electronic information service for blind and disabled persons:
 - (1) The Commission shall require all local exchange telecommunications companies to impose a periodic surcharge on bills rendered to all local exchange telecommunications company subscribers.
 - (2) The Commission, in consultation with the Director of the Division of Services for the Blind, shall annually determine the amount of the surcharge based on the amount of funding necessary to support the accessible electronic information service.
 - (3) The amount of the surcharge may be computed as a portion of any other surcharge required under existing law. In no event shall the surcharge exceed any existing surcharge by more than one cent (1¢) each line each month.
 - Local exchange telecommunications companies shall remit the amount received from the surcharge to the Director of the Division of Services for the Blind less any amounts allowed for administration in accordance with a schedule determined by the Commission in consultation with the Director of the Division of Services for the Blind.
- (f) Power to Regulate. The Commission shall have the same power to regulate the operation of the accessible electronic information service as it has to regulate any public utility subject to the provisions of this Chapter."
- **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) for the 2003-2004 fiscal year to be used by the Division of Services for the Blind to establish an accessible electronic information service for blind and disabled persons in this State.
 - **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
