1 A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE FOUNDERS OF THE TOWN OF
2 TROUTMAN ON THE TOWN'S ONE HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY.

3 Whereas, the Town of Troutman, located in Iredell County, will be
4 celebrating 100 years of incorporation in 2005; and

5 Whereas, Troutman was named for Mrs. Annie Troutman and her sons, Jacob
6 and Sidney, who settled in the area around 1853 and established a wagon shop; and

7 Whereas, the area had previously been known as Hickory Crossing; and

8 Whereas, the first officers of the Town were Mayor J.M. Patterson,
9 Commissioners A.D. Troutman, C.M. Wagner, and E.E. Kluttz, and Constable Jay F.
10 Brown; and

11 Whereas, during the Town's early history, much of its growth was as a result
12 of the railroad's expansion into the area; and

13 Whereas, the citizens of Troutman have made significant contributions to the
14 social, cultural, political, and economic prosperity of the State of North Carolina; and

15 Whereas, Troutman has continued to grow and prosper through the continued
16 dedication, insight, and planning of the Town's concerned leaders and citizens; and

17 Whereas, the Town of Troutman's 100th Anniversary is worthy of celebration
18 and should be enjoyed and supported by all North Carolinians; Now, therefore,

19 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

20 **SECTION 1.** The General Assembly honors the memory of the founders of
21 the Town of Troutman.

22 **SECTION 2.** The General Assembly joins the citizens of the Town of
23 Troutman in celebrating the Town's 100th Anniversary.

24 **SECTION 3.** The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this
25 resolution to the Mayor of the Town of Troutman.

26 **SECTION 4.** This resolution is effective upon ratification.
