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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE LIABILITY PROTECTION AND WORKERS'  
2 COMPENSATION FOR HEALTH CARE WORKERS WHEN RESPONDING TO  
3 IN-STATE INCIDENTS OUTSIDE THEIR HOSPITAL OR NORMAL  
4 JURISDICTION AS MEMBERS OF A STATE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TEAM.  
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6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 166A-14 reads as rewritten:

8 "**§ 166A-14. Immunity and exemption.**

9 (a) All functions hereunder and all other activities relating to emergency  
10 management are hereby declared to be governmental functions. Neither the State nor  
11 any political subdivision thereof, nor, except in cases of willful misconduct, gross  
12 negligence or bad faith, any emergency management worker complying with or  
13 reasonably attempting to comply with this Article or any order, rule or regulation  
14 promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this Article or pursuant to any ordinance  
15 relating to any emergency management measures enacted by any political subdivision  
16 of the State, shall be liable for the death of or injury to persons, or for damage to  
17 property as a result of any such activity.

18 (b) The rights of any person to receive benefits to which ~~he~~ the person would  
19 otherwise be entitled under this Article or under the Workers' Compensation Law or  
20 under any pension law, nor the right of any such person to receive any benefits or  
21 compensation under any act of Congress shall not be affected by performance of  
22 emergency management functions.

23 (c) Any requirement for a license to practice any professional, mechanical or  
24 other skill shall not apply to any authorized emergency management worker who shall,  
25 in the course of performing ~~his~~ the worker's duties as such, practice such professional,  
26 mechanical or other skill during a state of disaster.

1 (d) As used in this section, the term "emergency management worker" shall  
2 include any full or part-time paid, volunteer or auxiliary employee of this State or other  
3 states, territories, possessions or the District of Columbia, of the federal government or  
4 any neighboring country or of any political subdivision thereof or of any agency or  
5 organization performing emergency management services at any place in this State,  
6 subject to the order or control of or pursuant to a request of the State government or any  
7 political subdivision thereof. The term "emergency management worker" under this  
8 section shall also include a-any health care worker performing health care services as a  
9 member of a hospital-based or county-based State Medical Assistance Team and any  
10 person performing emergency health care services under G.S. 90-12.2.

11 (e) Any emergency management worker, as defined in this section, performing  
12 emergency management services at any place in this State pursuant to agreements,  
13 compacts or arrangements for mutual aid and assistance to which the State or a political  
14 subdivision thereof is a party, shall possess the same powers, duties, immunities and  
15 privileges ~~he~~ the person would ordinarily possess if performing ~~his~~ duties in the State,  
16 or political subdivision thereof in which normally employed or rendering services."

17 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
