## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 774**

Sponsors:Representative Owens.Referred to:Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House.March 17, 2005

A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THOSE WHO CONTRIBUTED TO THE 1 2 CONSTRUCTION OF THE DISMAL SWAMP CANAL ON THE TWO 3 HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY OF THIS HISTORIC LANDMARK. Whereas, the Dismal Swamp Canal is a 22-mile waterway that serves as part 4 5 of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway; and Whereas, the Dismal Swamp Canal is the oldest man-made continuously 6 7 operating waterway in the country, opening to boating traffic in 1805; and Whereas, Colonel William Byrd II proposed the Dismal Swamp Canal in 8 9 1728 after surveying the boundary between North Carolina and Virginia; and Whereas, in 1793, slaves and other laborers began the arduous task of digging 10 the canal by hand, completing the work approximately 12 years later; and 11 Whereas, the Dismal Swamp Canal is a living monument to the sacrifices of 12 13 the men who built it; and 14 Whereas, one of those men was Moses Grandy, born into slavery in Camden County around 1786, who after many years of working on the canal was able to 15 purchase his freedom with a portion of his earnings and whose life story was recorded 16 in the 1843 narrative, "The Life of Moses Grandy; Late a Slave in the United States of 17 America;" and 18 19 Whereas, today, the Dismal Swamp Canal attracts approximately 2,000 pleasure boats annually; and 20 Whereas, the Dismal Swamp Canal is listed on the National Register of 21 22 Historic Places, designated as a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark and recognized as part of the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Program; 23 24 and 25 Whereas, partners in a year-long celebration of the Dismal Swamp Canal's 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary are the Dismal Swamp Canal Welcome Center, Dismal Swamp State 26 Park and Natural Area, Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge, Virginia Canals 27 and Navigations Society, City of Chesapeake, and Elizabeth City State University; and 28 Whereas, future plans for the Dismal Swamp Canal include the Dismal 29 Swamp State Park, which will be made possible due to the efforts of the late Dr. Joseph 30

Armstrong Gill, a conservationist and avid outdoorsman, who was instrumental in 1 2 persuading the State to purchase land in the Great Dismal Swamp for use as a park; 3 Now, therefore, 4 Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring: 5 **SECTION 1.** The General Assembly honors the memory of Moses Grandy 6 and the many other laborers who constructed the Dismal Swamp Canal. 7 SECTION 2. The General Assembly honors the memory of Dr. Joseph 8 Armstrong Gill for his role in helping the creation of the future Dismal Swamp State 9 Park. 10 **SECTION 3.** The General Assembly encourages the citizens of this State to take part in activities commemorating the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Dismal Swamp 11 12 Canal. 13 **SECTION 4.** The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this 14 resolution to the Dismal Swamp Canal Welcome Center. 15 **SECTION 5.** This resolution is effective upon ratification.
